History of Mansfield Golf Club

Mansfield's first golf course – 9 holes adjacent to cemetery – 1910-1920

Mansfield Golf Club was officially formed on July 13, 1910 with a short course developed on land adjacent to the Mansfield Cemetery. The Club prospered for several years, but went into recess following the outbreak of the First World War, reforming in 1921.

Our second golf course – Fords Creek Course – 1921-1930

In 1921 the Club moved to land known as Smith's, a cow paddock of sorts on Fords Creek, where golf was played until 1930.

The courses were primitive, the greens were sand scrapes and fairways were grazing areas for livestock. No mechanical equipment was used on these courses. The Smith's course was so bad that in 1928 the Committee agreed to find suitable other land for the development of a new golf course. Through all this the Club produced some excellent golfers, one at least played off scratch and another, plus two.

Sale Yards Paddock – Development of current golf course – 1929 onwards.

A 12-hole golf course was first developed on land near the sale yards, with grass greens and mown fairways. In 1937 the Club purchased further adjacent land on which the remaining six holes were constructed.

The clubhouse on the Fords Creek course, primitive as it was, was moved to the Sale Yards course, where members enjoyed all the conviviality golf deserves.

Clubhouse – 1950

In 1950 a parcel of land, on which this clubhouse stands, was purchased. A new clubhouse was constructed, with the help of volunteer members. It was not until 1959 that the Club obtained a liquor licence. Part of the licensing requirements included clubhouse extensions incorporating showers and other amenities to the satisfaction of the licensing inspector.

This Club was the first country club in Victoria to be registered under the amended Liquor Licensing Act.

From this time onwards the Club purchased or acquired several parcels of land within the current golf course layout, including the practice fairway and the now currently vacant Elvins Street land, the many unused roads throughout the golf course, and other parcels on the perimeter as they became available.

Gaming Machines – 1994

Club House open seven days/week. Bar/Bistro/Gaming and Pro Shop. First General Manager appointed with full-time and part-time staff.

New Clubhouse – 1996

In 1995 the Club agreed to completely renovate and extend the clubhouse to provide a new facility for members, their guests and visitors.

This clubhouse stands as a tribute to the hard work and foresight of earlier members who helped to create the Club and develop a golf course for our enjoyment.

PGA Professional and Course Watering – 2000-2005

The Club engaged its first PGA Professional in 2000/2001 and installed a new fully automatic reclaimed watering system in 2003/2004.

General Information for Members

Competitions

Monday

Members and green fee players welcome. Bookings preferred.

Tuesday

Men's and Women's Competitions. Bookings essential. Members and green fee players welcome.

Bookings preferred.

Green fees for visiting golf club members playing in competition are waived on Tuesdays.

Wednesday

Women's Competition. Bookings essential.

Members and green fee players welcome. Bookings preferred.

Thursday

Men's Competition. (Women's Comp. Nov-Feb). Bookings essential. Members and green fee players welcome. Bookings preferred.

Tee Times between 11:30am – 1:15pm are reserved exclusively for Competition entry only.

Friday

Members and green fee players welcome. Bookings preferred.

Saturday

Men's and Women's Competitions. Bookings essential. AM tee-offs in the competition up until 9.00am off the first tee. Green fees welcome up to 9.00am off the tenth tee. Bookings essential through the Pro Shop on 5775 1218. PM tee-off in the competition. All competition will

be played off the first tee unless otherwise directed by the Match Committee or Club Professional. Daylight savings timesheet runs from 11am to 1:15pm. Winter (June, July, August) timesheet runs from 11am to 12:45pm. Normal timesheet (Non winter and daylight savings) runs from 11am to 1pm. Timesheets are located inside the pro shop and at the bar on Friday nights. Same sex or mixed groups permitted.

Sunday

Men's and Women's Competitions. Bookings essential. Members and green fee players welcome. Bookings preferred.

ORDER OF PLAY

Saturdays (Club timesheet operating)

- Male and female members to start from the first tee unless otherwise directed by starter.
Last tee-off time June, July, August 12:45pm.
Members playing Par, Stableford or Stroke rounds – groups must not consist of more than four players. Disqualification of all players in groups of more than four. The only exception to this rule is when playing in 4-Ball, Foursomes or Ambrose events.

Players are requested to place their names on the timesheet by 11.00am Saturday.

- Play is permitted in the mornings up to 9.00am on all competition days (unless otherwise directed) provided that the first and tenth tees are cleared by 11.00am after having completed nine holes.
- The Club Golf Professional is the ultimate steward in regards to timesheet at all times.
On all competition days (at the discretion of the steward)
- Competitors must pay requisite fees before

commencing play.

- On the completion of the round, the competitor's signed card must be placed in the box in the Pro Shop.
- Priorities on the first tee shall be as in the order of play above.

On all Sundays (other than official Stroke round days)

Priority on the first tee to be:

- (i) Official singles matches to 1.00pm
- (ii) Official 4-Ball matches
- (iii) Members playing in fours

ORDER OF PLAY – WEDNESDAYS

A timesheet will be operating between 9:30 am and 10:15 am from March to December. Shotgun starts 9.30 for 10.00 during autumn/winter /spring and 8.30 for 9.00 am during summer months.

- On days of larger fields, extended time or use of 10th tee may apply.
- To foster Club spirit, ladies are asked not to enter names on timesheet with same players on consecutive Wednesdays.
- To assist less experienced players, please try to arrange a wide range of handicaps in each group. In 4-Ball events, players are asked to select different partners if possible.
- The Club Golf Professional is the ultimate steward in regards to timesheet at all times.
- Players may play in the daily competition prior to the timesheet, BUT may need to wait on the turn for the timesheet entrants (both 9 and 18 hole players) to clear the tee.
- Players CANNOT enter the daily competition once the last of the timesheet entrants have commenced

play.

On all other days:

- Order of play as per rules of golf.

PRACTICE ON THE COURSE

- a) Practice (1) from tees; (2) to greens, or (3) on greens on competition days prior to playing is strictly forbidden, with the exception of MatchPlay events.
- b) Use of the Championship tees in practice is strictly forbidden.
- c) When playing a practice round, or part thereof, play with more than two balls is not permitted.
- d) The Club has wonderful practice facilities – greens, tees, bunker and nets.

RESOLVING TIES

Ties in special Club events shall where possible be decided by play-off; in other events by a count back as recommended by the VGA.

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH A COURSE RECORD IS RECOGNISED

Official Stroke rounds only. Course must be played at its official measured length and have no preferred lies or tee-ups, temporary tees or greens in play.

NEAREST TO PIN COMPETITIONS

In the event of a player holding 'nearest the pin' being disqualified, or not returning their card in the competition of the day, or entering the day for the purpose of submitting a card for handicapping purposes, the trophy WILL be awarded to that player.

NUMBER OF PLAYERS FOR COMPETITION

Minimum of 2 in normal competition events

Minimum of 8 in 4-Ball events

Minimum of 6 in Medal or donated trophy events

NUMBER OF PLAYERS FOR DIVISIONS (MEN)

One Division – Up to 40 players

Two Divisions – More than 40 players

HOLE IN ONE (members only)

Honour Board and Trophy - A hole in one will only be recognised during an official club competition handicapped round. Trophy only for other club sanctioned events eg Trade Day and Police Day.

VISITORS

Visitors may compete in all events except for Club trophy and Board events.

DRESS CODE

Members, guests and visitors are expected to adopt acceptable neat casual golf attire as a minimum standard for both the clubhouse and golf course.

Club Presidents, Club Captains, Club and Pro Shop Staff monitor dress standards.

ETIQUETTE OF GOLF

1. Members are requested to observe both the etiquette and the rules of golf at all times. They should at all times be appropriately dressed and act with tact and decorum. Rulebooks can be obtained at the Pro Shop free of charge.

2. Members must inspect the local rule board before start of play for temporary local rules or other information.
3. The lowest marker of each group of players is responsible for the observance of the following:
 - No player should move, talk or stand close to, or directly behind the ball or hole when a player is addressing a stroke.
 - Walk briskly between shots. In Stableford and Par competitions pick up your ball when your strokes have expended.
 - Players should leave the putting green immediately the play of the hole has been completed. Mark scorecards on the next tee.
4. Players who realise they have a 'lost ball' should call following players through and when so-called following players must immediately play through. The group in which the ball was lost must not continue play until the players called through are out of range. They then have up to five minutes to find the ball before a new ball must be bought into play.
5. Before leaving a bunker, all players must carefully fill up all holes and smooth any marks made by them therein.
6. A player should carry a sand bucket at all times and ensure that any turf cut or displaced by a player is replaced at once and pressed down. Failing this the divot made must be filled with sand after the shot.

7. While on the putting green players should ensure that:
 - Pitch marks made by a ball are repaired.

Utmost care is taken to avoid damage to the green and surround while moving and when placing bags or the flagstick.

8. Players must not shout or talk loudly whilst playing the course, except in an emergency when a warning in the prescribed manner may be called.
9. A player who has incurred a penalty MUST indicate the fact to their opponent or marker as soon as possible.
10. Players should, at all times, play without undue delay. This means taking your shot as soon as appropriate, then completing other activities.
11. All players should report to the starter at least fifteen (15) minutes before hit-off time.
12. Mobile phones must be turned off before commencement of play and should only be used in case of emergency.

INTERMEDIATE AND RESTRICTED MEMBERS

Intermediate Members

Are entitled to use the golf course playing facilities on any weekday and on Sundays but shall not be entitled to use the playing facilities on Saturdays except upon such terms and conditions and subject to such requirements as the Committee may from time to time prescribe.

Restricted Members

Are entitled to use the golf course playing facilities on any weekday which is not a public holiday but shall not be entitled to use the playing facilities on any Saturday or Sunday or any weekday which is a public holiday except upon such terms and conditions and subject to such requirements and regulations as the Committee may from time to time prescribe.

Intermediate and Restricted Members may be permitted to play in special Club competitions held on weekends. Such members should approach the Club Captain or Secretary/Manager to determine the particular events in which they may be given permission to play and the conditions of play.

Green Fees

All day green fee \$30.00

*Groups of 20+ people – green fees may be discounted – see Pro Shop

Visitors from other clubs may play in Tuesday's competition without having to pay green fees.

Women's Special Events Programme

Club Championships

The Club Championships, which is open to all members, shall be decided over three (3) nominated stroke rounds in October. These dates are Wednesday 3rd October, Wednesday 10th October and Wednesday 17th October. A timesheet will be operating 9.00 to 10.30 or until all entries are teed off continuously as near to 10.30 am as possible. Match Committee will determine handicap limits for all divisions prior to the first round. In the event of a tie after three (3) stroke rounds a play-off will occur on the 1st, 8th and 9th holes and in the event of a further tie a sudden death play off will apply on the 1st hole followed by the 8th and/or 9th.

In the event of unplayable conditions on one or more days, the championships shall be reduced after consultation of the match committee to a minimum of one and a half rounds. If play on the first round of the championships is abandoned or washed out this round shall be rescheduled on Saturday 6th October commencing at 9.00 am. If the second round of the championships cannot be completed this round shall be reduced to a minimum of nine (9) holes or if no play is possible this round shall be abandoned.

In the event of the final round being washed out or abandoned then providing a minimum of 27 holes has been played a result will be achieved. If the required 27 holes have not been completed then play will be scheduled for the Saturday 20th October.

The match committee has the discretion to change playing conditions if deemed necessary.

If a player requires the use of a motorized cart to compete in the Club Championships a medical certificate must be produced for Match Committee approval.

Club Match Play Championships

Two (2) qualifying rounds will be played for the Match Play Championships, which is open to all members, on Wednesday October 3rd (or corresponding rescheduled round) and Wednesday October 10th . The top four players in each division will play off. The first round on Sunday 21st October and the final on Saturday 27th October. The rounds will be played as follows 1 vs. 4 and 2 vs. 3.

In the event of less than four players qualifying the playoffs will be played between the top 2 qualifiers. A Grade final round to be played over 27 holes.

If a player requires the use of a motorized cart to compete in the Club MatchPlay Championships a medical certificate must be produced for Match Committee approval.

Fraser Family Trophy

A perpetual trophy, donated by Christine and Ian Fraser, awarded to the member aged 70 years or more on the

1st January, who returns the lowest net score over the completed rounds of the Club's annual championship.

Monthly Medals

A minimum of six (6) players are required for a monthly medal to be played. The number of divisions will depend on entry numbers as per regular weekly competitions. Medal winner will be determined by the lowest net score and will receive the medal, the divisional voucher and if sponsored the sponsors prize. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by a countback.

Medal of Medals

The Medal of Medals is played off on the Saturday stroke round of 10th November and incorporates the Monthly Medal winners over the months of November 2011 to October 2012 inclusive. All entrants to this event must play within the allotted timesheet. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by a sudden death play off at the conclusion of play.

Parks Medal

The Parks Medal is played off on the Saturday stroke round of 3rd November and incorporates the Monthly Medal winners over the months of March to October (inclusive). In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by a sudden death play off at the conclusion of play.

Captain's Trophy (Mar-Oct)

The Captain allocates points for the leading scores in all 18-hole singles competitions played between March and October inclusive.

Veteran's Event

Open to all players sixty (60) years of age and over on the first day of the event. An aggregate of the two (2) best scores out of three (3), played on set dates. The first round to be played on Wednesday 25th April, the second round Wednesday 9th May and the third round Wednesday 26th May. In the event of a tie, a play off over 18 holes will be played on the stroke round on Wednesday 27th June in conjunction with the competition of the day. In the event of a tie in the play off the winner will be decided by a count back.

Golden Putter Award

Donated by Lyn and John Foots. Awarded to the player returning the lowest round of putting strokes on any Stroke round competition between March to October inclusive. In the event of a draw all winners awarded.

Stella Golf Handicap Reduction Trophy

This trophy is sponsored by Alison Munt & Nicola Moutt, Mansfield Golf Professionals for the greatest handicap reduction for each nominated division.

Summer Cup (Nov – Feb)

Four nominated rounds to be played on Wednesdays and Sundays during the months of November to February inclusive. Each round will consist of 18 holes stableford and the best score for each month will be recorded for the aggregate score. Competitors must play a minimum of one round each month to qualify. Aggregate of scores determines the winner. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by a total

of the last three (3) months best scores. In the event of a further tie, the last two best scores will count.

Summer Aggregate (Nov – Feb)

The Summer Aggregate will be awarded to the member returning the best net aggregate score of five (5) stroke rounds played between November and February. In the event of a tie, the best four (4) rounds to count.

Summer Eclectic (Handicap & Scratch) (Nov – Feb)

The Summer Eclectic will apply to any 18 hole singles events and 9 hole events on Thursdays. Half the current handicap as at the first day of competition will be used to calculate the winning score. In the event of a tie all winners will be awarded.

Summer Gobblers (Nov - Feb)

The Summer Gobblers will apply to any 18 hole singles events. A gobbler represents a shot played from off the green that is holed out (eg chipped in). The gobbler is not counted if a player putts a ball off the green and then chips in.

George Walker Memorial Trophy (Nov – Feb)

Played in conjunction with the Thursday open 9-hole competition. An aggregate of the best eight (8) scores will determine the winner. In the event of a tie, the best seven scores and so on until a clear winner is determined.

Winter Aggregate (Mar – Oct)

The Winter Aggregate will be awarded to the member returning the best net aggregate score of six (6) stroke

rounds during March to October inclusive. In the event of a tie, the best five (5) rounds will count.

Winter Eclectic (Handicap & Scratch) (Mar - Oct)

The Winter Eclectic will apply to any 18 hole singles event and any 9 hole event on Tuesdays. Half the current handicap as at the first day of competition will be used to calculate the winning score. In the event of a tie all winners will be awarded.

3's and under (Mar – Apr – May – Jun)

The 3's and under will apply to any 18 hole singles event. In the event of a tie, all winners will be awarded.

Net 3s (Jul – Aug – Sept – Oct)

The Net 3s will apply to any 18 hole singles event. A net score of 3 or better on a par 3 e.g. if you score less than the number of shots your handicap allows or betters 3, that is a net 3. In the event of a tie, all winners will be awarded.

Winter Gobblers (Mar to Oct)

The Winter Gobblers will apply to any 18 hole singles event. A gobbler represents a shot played from off the green that is holed out (eg chipped in). The gobbler is not counted if a player putts a ball off the green and then chips in.

Aggregate Putting (Mar – Oct)

The aggregate putting competition trophy is for the aggregate 10 best putting scores returned on all stroke rounds between March and October.

Silver Spoon: (W.G.V.)

Winners or tied winners of four rounds of stroke played on 4th April, 9th May, 26th May and 6th June will qualify for the final to be played on 4th July. To qualify you may play on any or all rounds. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on a count back. The club winner will receive a small WGV Silver Spoon and is eligible to play in the Victorian final. Date to be confirmed.

International Bowl (W.G.V.)

Proceeds of this event raise funds to finance top elite golfers at International Events. Three divisions – Silver: Scratch to 18. - Bronze 1: 19 to 36 - Bronze 2: 37 to 45
Entry entitles players to return cards in one or all rounds. The nominated rounds are 4th April, 9th May and 26th May. Winner is determined by the number of strokes (if any) by which the AWCR is beaten. In the event of a tie, a count back will determine the winner.

Mona McLeod Brooch:

Played in conjunction with the Silver Spoon and International Bowl. Nominated rounds are 4th April, 9th May, 26th May and 27th June. The aggregate net of the two best rounds returned by which the AWCR is beaten will determine the winner.

North East Brooch: (NEDLGA)

An 18 hole stroke handicap competition to be played on the 6th June. The winner will be decided by the number of strokes (if any) by which the AWCR is beaten. In the event of a tie, a count back shall be done as per WGV regulations. Proceeds help finance Junior Promotion of Golf in the North East.

NEDLGA Pennant:

An information session will be held on the 11th January at 2.30pm for all interested ladies wishing to play pennant for the Mansfield Golf Club. Players will be required to complete a form indicating their dates of availability for the season. A fixture will be made available during mid-February from the Captain.

Block Entry:

A fee for entry into the above events will be charged in Blocks. Summer Block Entry for the months of November 2011 to February 2012 of \$15.00. Winter Block Entry for the months of March to October 2012 of \$20.00 and the Summer Block Entry for November 2012 to February 2013 of \$15.00. These amounts cover all entries into Club, North East and WGV events listed above.

Men's Special Events Programme

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Club Championship (open to all members) and the minor championships B, C and D grades, as well as Junior Champion, shall be decided over four (4) stroke rounds in October this year – 6th October, 7th 13th October & 20th October. Handicap limits for B, C and D grades decided by Match Committee prior to first round.

A draw will be made on the prior Friday, for the first round. Names must be on board by that date and time. A seeded draw for the final two (2) rounds will be made after the first round. In event of ties after four rounds, play-offs will be held at the conclusion of play.

CLUB MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS

A Match Play Championship will be held between the top four players in each division of the first (1st) and third (3rd) rounds of the Club Championship and played over two (2) days in October. The first final over 18 holes is to be played on Sunday 21st October with the final to be played on Saturday 27th October. A Grade final to be played over 36 holes. B,C & D grade finals to be played over 27 holes.

MID-WEEK CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Mid-Week Championships will be decided over three (3) rounds of Stableford on 26th April, 10th May and 17th May.

PRESIDENT'S DAY 2012

3 Person Ambrose will be played on Saturday, September 8th for trophies donated by the Club. Players are asked to arrange their own partners and opponents. Shot gun start at 12.30pm.

MEDAL OF MEDALS

Funds to facilitate the purchase of annual trophies, event continuity and an honour board were donated to the Club by the Late Austin G. Redfern, a Life Member of the Club. Austin Redfern served as a very competent Secretary of the Club for many years and like the two Bill's, Glen and Reardon, maintains legendary status amongst those members who knew him. The Medal of Medals is played on a Saturday Stroke round on or after the October Monthly Medal and incorporates all of the Monthly Medal winners over the months of October to September. This year the event will be

held in conjunction with the final round of the Club Championships to be held on Saturday 20th October. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by a sudden-death play-off at the conclusion of play.

J.D. PERKS SCRATCH TROPHY

A trophy donated by J.D. Perks will be presented to the player who wins the most J.D. Perks Scratch Events on Monthly Medal days.

CAPTAIN'S TROPHY

To be won by the competitor obtaining the highest number of points in the Monthly Medal competitions, April to October. The winner on each of these days will receive ten points; the runner-up will receive nine points, and so on down to tenth in the competition, which will receive one point. Ties will share the points.

FOUNDERS' TROPHY

T.M.R. Ryan, a Life Member and former President of the Club, in appreciation of the members who founded and have contributed to the improvement of the Mansfield Golf Club, donated this trophy. The competitor returning the lowest net aggregate score over the four (4) rounds of the Club Championship will win this trophy.

DATES FOR J.D. NEELY TROPHY & J NOLAN 4-BALL

All matches for these events must be played only as allocated in programme. It is the responsibility of the losers in all matches to record the match result on the board on completion.

J.D. NEELY TROPHY

Silver Tray donated by the Neely family as a perpetual trophy for this prestigious event. The late Mr J.D. Neely was a member of the Club at the time land was purchased and the course, as we know it today, was first constructed. Mr Neely organized and paid for architects to design the original clubhouse at 24 Kidston Parade. Entries for this Singles Knockout Match Play event close in November 2011. A draw will then be made for first round matches to be played as allocated in the programme.

J. NOLAN 4-BALL KNOCKOUT

The family of the late J. Nolan kindly donated funds to the Club to assist with the funding of annual trophies and event continuity. Mr Nolan was a long-term member who contributed significantly to the health and well being of the Club in its formative years. Entries for this exciting 4-Ball Match Play Knockout event close in December in 2011 and November in 2012, or at the discretion of the Committee. First round matches to be played on or before December 18 2011. The remaining rounds are to be played on or before dates allocated in program. To foster Club spirit the Committee recommends that competitors play with different partners each year.

J.N. PICKERING AGGREGATE MEMORIAL TROPHY

Funds and silver cups were donated by the late J.N. Pickering to assist with the purchase of annual trophies and ensure event continuity. The trophy will be awarded to the member returning the best 12 net aggregate Saturday Stroke rounds during the months of November to October annually. Mr Pickering, a low marker, was

made a Life Member of the Club in 1972. Mr. Pickering made and donated the very first fairway mower tractor to operate on the golf course.

J.G. SMITH MEMORIAL TROPHY

This Memorial Trophy, a sterling silver cup donated by the late J.G. Smith, is awarded to the junior member (under 21 years of age on the date of the qualifying round) returning the lowest net aggregate score over the qualifying rounds of the Club Championships.

Gordon Smith served as Club President for five years in the early 1950's and excelled in the area of junior golf development.

Junior Club Champion Trophy

This was a new trophy event in 2011 donated by Mr Tony Crawford and Jackie Pollock of Mansfield Pizza, It is awarded to the junior member (under 18 years of age on the date of the first qualifying round) returning the lowest scratch score over the four (4) qualifying rounds of the Club Championships.

SUMMER CUP

The Summer Cup, a sterling silver trophy donated by the late E.C. Parsons, is awarded to the male competitor returning the highest aggregate stableford score of Thursday rounds played during the months of November, December, January and February. The competitor's better score each month to count towards his aggregate score. The late E.C. Parsons was made a Life Member of the Club. Mr. Parsons was vitally interested in the construction and maintenance of the golf course. Each year he donated a week of his time, his staff and machinery to assist in course

development. Bill and Sue Parsons donated the trust funds for this event to assist with the purchase of annual trophies. Bill Parsons is also a Life Member of the Club.

THE GRIMWADE CUP

A perpetual trophy, donated by Andrew Grimwade, awarded each year to the member aged 75 years or more on the 1st January, who returns the lowest net score over the four rounds of the Club's annual championship.

Men's and Women's Special Events Programme

Club Handicap Championship - The Bill Reardon Memorial Trophy

Funds and annual trophies donated by the family of the Late D.D. (Bill) Reardon to assist with the purchase of annual trophies and ensure event continuity.

Bill Reardon was a long-term member of the Club and served on the General Committee and a number of sub-committees, including 16 consecutive years as Club Captain. Bill was elected an Honorary Life Member of Mansfield Golf Club and served with distinction on the North Eastern District Golf Association.

This Handicap Championship for men and women is open to all members of the Club and is to be decided over a combination of two qualifying Stroke rounds – for the men March Monthly Medal and April Monthly Medal, followed by a semi-final consisting of 18 holes of Match Play between the top four qualifiers on Sunday 20 May and then a Match Play final played over 27 holes on Sunday 27 May – For the ladies two qualifying rounds, the first on March Monthly Medal day and the second on April Monthly Medal Day followed by a

semi-final consisting of 18 holes of Match Play between the top four qualifiers on Sunday 27 May and then a Match Play final played over 27 holes on Sunday 1 July.

K.J. EVANS MEMORIAL FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP

An honour board event donated by the family of the late K.J. Evans. Funds were donated to the Club by the late Mrs K.J. Evans to facilitate the funding of annual trophies and event continuity. Ken Evans was made a Life Member of both the Mansfield Golf Club and North East District Golf Association in honour of his tireless work for both entities. Separate events are played for male and female members. This Scratch Championship is played over 36 holes for men (18 holes in the morning with a compulsory break for lunch & 18 holes in the afternoon) and 27 holes for ladies (9 holes am with a compulsory break for lunch & 18 holes pm). The handicap event is played on Saturday June 2nd over 18 holes. In the event of a tie in the Championship a play-off will be conducted at the conclusion of the final round. The handicap event shall be decided by a count back.

GLEN FOURSOMES

Mr and Mrs W.H. Glen, to assist with the funding of annual trophies and to ensure event continuity, donated funds and a sterling silver cup. This event provides an opportunity for members of all categories to play in a mixed foursome event over 27 holes on Saturday, May 5. In the event of a tie a count back will determine winners. Both Bill and Shirley Glen are valuable Life Members of the Club having served in many different capacities over a very long period of time. Bill's service at Association level was also recognized with Life Membership.

PARSONS FATHER-SON and FAMILY TEAM

A Father-Son and Family Team event will be held on Saturday 24th March 2012. Trophies donated by W. & S. Parsons. In the Father-Son event one person must be a member of Mansfield Golf Club and the other can be a member of any golf club. In the Family Team event, one family member must be a member of Mansfield Golf Club and the other can be a member of any golf club (husband and wife teams are excluded).

George Walker Memorial Trophy

A Thursday event during daylight savings period for men, November to Feb for ladies. Men's play shall be off the first tee scoring on a front nine, back nine alternating basis. Women's play shall be on a front nine, back nine alternating basis.

MEN'S Summer Eclectic

A Stableford event played in conjunction with the 18-hole Thursday Stableford rounds and the George Walker Memorial. Best individual hole scores from the alternating front nine, back nine results are recorded on a weekly basis. The best overall 18 holes score at the end is the winner.

Scoring Club Golf Competitions

Stroke Play

Stroke is the most common type of competition played by professional golfers around the world. It is the true test of a golfer's ability, as every stroke must be recorded. The number of strokes taken at each hole is entered onto each player's card, then totaled for each nine holes and then again for the full 18 holes. At club level using handicaps, each player's handicap is deducted from his or her gross score to give a net score. The player with the lowest net score is the winner. To win a Stroke competition you must play consistently. One or two poor holes usually proves costly and puts an end to your chances of winning.

Match Play

Match Play is a game where players play against each other, hole by hole, to determine the winner. The player with the lowest score wins the particular hole, and therefore is said to be "one up" in the Match Play situation. The hole is halved if both players complete the hole with the same score. The player who is leading by a number of holes greater than the number of holes remaining, for example 5 holes up after the 14th hole with 4 holes left to play, wins the match. If your opponent wins all four holes remaining, you are still one hole up at the 18th, so the match is finished early at the 14th hole, the result being 5 and 4. In a handicap match, the lowest net score wins the hole. If there is a difference of handicaps, an eight handicap player would have to give a 19 handicap player 11 strokes. These strokes would be allocated over the eight holes according to the Match Play index on the scorecard. The bottom line is to beat your opponent's score to win the hole – birdies and pars are of no significance.

Match Play has different rules to Stroke Play, and it is advisable to be familiar with these rules before entering into a match, as a mistake could cost you a hole and the match.

Stableford Competition

The Stableford Competition is the most popular event played at club level. Stableford is a game of points based on your score for each hole.

An EAGLE (two under par) scores four points.

A BIRDIE (one under par) scores three points.

A PAR scores two points.

A BOGEY (one over par) scores one point.

A DOUBLE BOGEY (two over par) or worse scores no points in a club situation where handicaps are used; you must check the scorecard to see where each player receives strokes.

You do this by using the general index/rating column. For example, a player with an 18 handicap receives one stroke on every hole. If that player scores a bogey 5 on a par 4, he or she deducts one stroke making it a net 4 (or a net par) and the player will score two points (5-2 to appear on the scorecard). An example of how to score 3 points would be a player scores a par 4 on a par 4, minus his or her handicap shot, equals a net 3 or birdie, equals 3 points (4-3 to appear on scorecard). Players who exceed their own par by two strokes score no points for the hole and should pick up their ball to keep play moving. At the end of the round, all points scored are added for each nine holes and totaled for 18 holes. The player with the most points is the winner. 36 points for men is playing to your handicap – anything above this and you have a chance to win the day.

Par Competition

Par Competition is similar to that of Stableford. It is a game based on wins, losses or halves for each hole.

A BIRDIE (one under par) or better scores a win or a "+"

A PAR scores a half or "0"

A BOGEY one over par or worse scores a loss or a "-"

In a club situation, where handicaps are used, you must check the scorecard to see where each player receives strokes. You do this by using the general index/rating column. For example, a player with an 18 handicap receives one stroke on every hole. If that player scores a bogey 5 on a par 4, he or she deducts one stroke making it a net 4 (or a net par), and the player will score a half or a 0 (5 0 to appear on scorecard). An example of a win or "+" would be a player scores a par 4 on a par 4, minus his or her handicap shot, equals a net 3 or birdie, equals a win or "+" (4 + to appear on scorecard). At the end of nine holes, and the round, your score is calculated by deducting the total losses (-) from the total wins (+). The halves (0) are considered even and have no bearing on your result. The player with the highest win (+) result is the winner.

The main disadvantage of this type of competition is that if you shoot a birdie and your net result is an eagle, you gain no benefit, as you only score a win (+).

Foursomes

Foursomes is a Stroke event played with a partner using only one golf ball. The rules require the partners to hit-off from alternate tees with alternate shots thereafter. Player A may select the even numbered holes, leaving player B to contend with the odd numbered holes. Once a player has teed off, you strike the ball alternately until the hole is completed. A team's handicap is found by

adding both players' handicaps together, and then dividing the total by two. For example, 12 plus 22 = 34, divided by 2 = 17. The stroke score for each hole is on the scorecard, and totalled as in Stroke Play. The team with the lowest net score is the winner. Foursomes is fun, however you will feel the added pressure on your game to keep your shots consistent to ensure a happy partnership and a low score.

4-Ball Match Play

This event is a popular game played at club level. It involves two teams of two players and is played under the same conditions as individual Match Play. Handicaps are worked out by making the lowest marker play off zero or scratch, and the other three handicaps are the difference between their handicap and the lowest.

For example:

Normal Handicap 4-Ball Match Play Handicap Player 1 (Handicap 5, plays off 0), Player 2 (12 7), Player 3 (18 13), Player 4 (26 21).

Strokes are taken from the Match Play index on the scorecard. At the end of each hole the best net score for each pair determines their result. If the best net score is the same, the hole is halved. If the first pair have a lower net score than the other pair, the result is a "+" or a win, leaving the other pair with a "-" or a loss. The pair with the most "+" wins.

4-Ball Stableford

This game involves two players playing as partners, using the same scoring system as individual Stableford. Players retain their full handicap throughout the round, the difference being only the best Stableford score between the two players has his or her score entered

on the card. Only one score is required – the score of the player who first completes the hole shall be recorded if both players score equally on the hole. The team with the most number of Stableford points after 18 holes is the winner. A great result can be achieved by having a good hole when your partner is having difficulty, and vice versa.

4-Ball Par

This game involves two players playing as partners using the same scoring system as individual Par. Players retain their full handicap throughout the round, the difference being only the best score between the two players for each hole is recorded on the scorecard. If both players score equally on the hole, the score of the player who first completed the hole shall be recorded. Only one score is required. The team with the highest (+) result is the winner. A great result can be achieved by having a good hole when your partner is having difficulty, and vice versa.

Ambrose Events

This is a team competition; each team shall consist of two, three or four persons. The team usually selects a Captain who is responsible for the order and speed of play and marking the scorecard. He or she is usually the lowest marker and most knowledgeable as far as golf is concerned.

Teams shall determine their own order of play and may change the order during the event.

Team members shall play their ball. The best or preferred ball selected for the play of the next shot shall be marked. All team members shall prefer their ball within one club length of the marked/preferred ball no nearer the hole.

On the putting green all balls must be placed and putted from within one card length of the selected ball no nearer the hole. Selected ball must be played first. Teams may elect to putt out if they so wish.

Each team member must take a minimum number of drives depending on the number of players in each team and the type of Ambrose being played, with their respective drives entered on the scorecard and initialled accordingly.

Ambrose is a stroke event with each team score recorded for each hole of the 18-hole event.

Handicap shall be Minimum number of drives shall be

4 Person Ambrose	1/8	3
3 Person Ambrose	1/6	4
2 Person Ambrose	1/4	6

These rules shall apply to each and every Ambrose event conducted by Mansfield Golf Course (except Holden Scramble events).
